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Vice President's message

The Hong Kong College of Education and Research in Nursing (HKCERN), (currently accredited until 2018), has as its focal point scholarship in teaching and research. Our mission is to promote and recognize teaching and research excellence. In the past few years, we are grateful to have gained the support and contribution from many nursing academia and educators to be our members. We all work closely together in achieving our mission. Since the inception in March 2012, HKCERN has conferred 125 Fellow Members, referred to as "grandfathers/ grandmothers" (i.e., RNs/RMs with more than 15 years of specialized practice) from various universities and education institutes.

In the past few years, we have set up a training programme and examination system to provide potential HKCERN members a clear roadmap for developing specialization in education and research. Interested parties who have achieved the required theoretical and clinical training hours are eligible to sit for the specialty examination with 150 Multiple-choice Questions. Those who pass the examination are qualified as HKCERN members. Members who achieve significant contributions in nursing education and research are subsequently conferred as HKCERN Fellows.

With the new establishment of nursing programmes in universities and education institutes, the demand for nurse educators and academic is now higher than ever before. Though new teachers may receive training from their organizations on education and pedagogy, most of those training programmes are not nursing specific. HKCERN is obliged to fill this gap and offers more courses that cater specifically to nursing educators and researchers. Courses we have offered, such as the Multiple Choice Question Writing Workshops and Micro-teaching Courses, have received very positive feedback in the past few years.

Though several developed countries recognize nursing specialization as mainly those from clinical specialties, education and research remains the overarching core foundation for the growth and development of *all* clinical specialties. We are glad that Hong Kong nurses acknowledge the need to set up HKCERN as an independent college for the specialization in nursing education and research. For the benefit of the whole Hong Kong Academy of Nursing (HKAN), HKCERN takes a pivotal role in nursing to prepare competent educators and researchers by working collaboratively with Academy Colleges of different clinical specialties. On January 16, 2016, HKAN orchestrated a strategic plan by inviting all the Academy Colleges to set action plans on five strategic areas. Among these areas, HKCERN was nominated to take the lead in developing publications to promote advanced nursing practice. With concerted effort, we proudly see dreams of nursing specialization coming true in Hong Kong.

The HKCERN organized a visit to the Hong Kong Police College (HKPC) on January 22, 2016 (Friday). Nine of our Fellows joined the visit at the Aberdeen Campus of the Police College. It was aimed at understanding the strategies of the HKPC in providing education with an emphasis on self- and lifelong learning, principles of integrity, innovative technology and leadership development.




The Police College was established in January 2006, prior to being known as the Police Training Wing. In 2015, it was restructured into 3 schools, supplemented by divisions. The schools include: School of Foundation Training, School of Professional Development, and School of Specialized Learning. The 3 schools are further divided into various divisions to provide specialized services. The College believes that officers should take responsibility for their own learning and therefore adopted the "Learning Trio" as its overall approach to police education. The "Learning Trio" includes formal training delivered by the College that targets officers of different years of experience and service needs, for on-the-job learning, and self-study by officers on their own time. A number of training programmes offered by the Police College have been accredited by local or overseas tertiary institutes, as well as the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications (HKCAAVQ). Moreover they are recognized by the Hong Kong Qualifications Framework (HKQF). Under this framework, police benefit from studies that are benchmarked in accordance with tertiary institutes (i.e., higher diploma or Bachelor's Degree).

Through the visit, the HKCERN was invited by the Police College to share non-policing knowledge that both our professions may find interesting and useful. More specifically, a platform was created to share experiences and a vision for development of our next generation. At present, a few HKCERN Fellows have showed interest in sharing their areas of expertise with the Police Force. Our intention is to continue to learn from each other and gain insight about what possible directions we may move towards to enhance practice and interact with experts from other disciplines.

Feb 19 – Apr 1, 2016 Micro-teaching course



A Micro-teaching Course was held on February 19, 2016 to April 1, 2016 at The Hong Kong Polytechnic University. This course provided novice teachers with comprehensive knowledge and skills about practical aspects of teaching in clinical and classroom settings. It also improved and updated skills addressing the changing roles of teachers and students. An environment for practice-based teaching was used to instill participants with self-evaluative skills in small groups.

World Health Day was held on April 9, 2016. In total, 6 booths accommodated experts providing health checks, diabetic knowledge, and games from various specialties.
